COVID-19 PROTOCOLS

We would like to remind families to use the <u>STAY AT HOME GUIDE</u> to determine when to keep your child home from school and when it is safe to return. Complete the <u>COVID-19 Alberta Health Daily Checklist</u> (for children under 18) with your child every day. The questionnaire will help determine if it's safe to send your child to school. If the answer is "Yes" to any of the questionnaire questions, DO NOT send your child to school. Stay home and see the instructions on the <u>STAY AT HOME GUIDE</u>. If the answer is "No" to all the questions, your child can attend school. MASK PROTOCOL

Parents who drop off and pick up students in person are reminded that even though they may be outdoors, public health measures remain in effect. Please ensure you maintain a minimum of two metres away from others who are not part of your immediate household and if that's not possible, a mask is required—even outside. The Chief Medical Officer of Health has indicated there has been outdoor spread when these measures haven't been followed, and we want to ensure our school community remains healthy and helps prevent further transmission of COVID-19.

VISITORS TO THE SCHOOL

Please be reminded that non-essential visitors are not permitted in the school. If you need to pick up/drop off your child or drop something off for them, please call the school upon your arrival at 780-467-7751, and a staff member will meet you at the doors to assist.

OUARTER 4 FEES

NOTE: As of May 13th, parents will have the ability to transfer overpayment credits between siblings, between schools, and between school and Transportation.

ATTENDANCE

Please communicate your child's absence directly to the school office at 780-467-7751, or email general.wbo@eips.ca or click the STUDENT ATTENDANCE link on the homepage of the school website. These emails are both checked regularly by the school office staff. Do not communicate this information only to the teacher. Situations occur when the homeroom teacher is away, and your information will not be received by the office staff who are required to maintain an accurate record of attendance for students throughout the day.

When reporting a student's absence, a reason is necessary. If your child is ill, we will need to know what the symptoms of the illness are as part of the COVID-19 screening requirements.
