INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL OVER THE CHRISTMAS BREAK

As the Christmas break approaches, we wish to remind you of federal public health regulations related to when students are permitted to return to school after travelling outside of Canada. Unvaccinated or partially vaccinated students under 12 years of age travelling with fully vaccinated parents or guardians cannot return to school or daycare for 14 days following their return to Canada, and must follow the <u>mandatory requirements</u> under the Minimizing the Risk of Exposure to COVID-19 in Canada Order.

Fully vaccinated students 12 years and older who travelled out of the country can return to school without delay so long as they are asymptomatic. If unvaccinated or partially vaccinated, these students are subject to the Government of Canada's required 14-day quarantine, regardless of whether they are accompanied by a parent or guardian who qualifies as a fully vaccinated traveller.
