### KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION STARTS SOON

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2018? If so, it's time to register for kindergarten.

Kindergarten registration opens for the 2018-19 school year on Jan. 15, 2018. To register, simply complete the online registration form at [www.eips.ca/kindergarten](http://www.eips.ca/kindergarten).

#### *KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION CHECK LIST:*

- Determine your child's designated school
- Scan and upload all required documents: proof of name, residence, date of birth and citizenship.
- Additional documents to scan, if applicable include: Guardian Letter and Parental Custody Agreement if restrictions on access.
- Once the online registration is complete and submitted, a confirmation notice is sent to the given email address.

*NOTE:* The online registration form is available as of Jan.15, 2018 - the paper version no longer exists.

To help families prepare, Elk Island Public Schools has put together an online toolkit to make the transition as smooth as possible. The kit includes information on registration, important dates, programming options, what to expect, eligibility, how to find your designated school, transportation and more. ## 2018-19 KINDERGARTEN SCHEDULE

**SCHEDULE CHANGES**

With the district implementing full-day kindergarten, the schedule has been standardized district wide. Logos kindergarten will now be on Mondays and Thursdays with alternating Wednesdays. Community (regular) kindergarten will now be on Tuesdays and Fridays with alternating Wednesdays. The calendars are located at the end of the newsletter.

**RE-ENROLLMENT & REQUEST TO ATTEND A NON-DESIGNATED SCHOOL**

Effective for the 2018-19 school year, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) is changing the way in which students apply to attend a non-designated school. From March 1 to 15, 2018, parents of **all** EIPS students are being asked to pre-enrol their children online and indicate whether their child will be attending their designated school or if they wish to register at a different school. Acceptance at a non-designated school is based on available space – families will be advised of the outcome by April 13, 2018. Because of high enrolment numbers, some schools won't be accepting any non-designated students. Schools with closed boundaries will be identified prior to the pre-enrolment process.

Please note that should you request a non-designated school for your child and need busing, there are fees associated with this choice. Visit [Transportation Services](#) for more information.

As part of the pre-enrolment process, parents are also asked to check and update phone numbers, email addresses, mailing address and other important data – doing so will both make sure that the Division has the most current information available and eliminate the need to fill in the paper Correction Form that has traditionally been sent home every fall. Better yet, families will be able to go online and update their child's data throughout the year as circumstances change.



- Do they pause at punctuation? Do they pause at the end of a line?

### Meet Punky Pig

 <p><b>Punky Pig</b></p> <p>Punky pays attention to punctuation. He slows down and reads it correctly!</p>	<p>Punctuation is important. Have you seen the memes that show the difference between “Let’s eat, Grandpa” and “Let’s eat Grandpa”?</p> <p>Punctuation helps the reader understand text.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A comma means pause and a period means take a longer pause</li><li>• A question mark can be indicated by raising the pitch of your voice a little.</li><li>• An explanation point can be indicated by raising the volume of your voice.</li><li>• Sometimes students will pause at the end of a line of text, rather than at the end of a sentence. By reading punctuation correctly, it will also help them to write as they will know intuitively what punctuation to use.</li></ul>

## COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

Happy New Year to all of you! For those of us immersed in the world of schooling, it is hard to determine the true beginning of the year - September or January. We return from Christmas holidays in similar places to where we left. The same class. The same school. The same teacher. And yet most of us can feel the opportunity for reflection. It is a time to look back at what was, and a time to look ahead at what *could* be. In the fast-paced society that we find ourselves in, such times of reflection can be rare and valuable. Usually, it is in these times that we see areas of our lives that we would like to change. For some, this brings insecurities and inadequacies to the surface. Moving back into the flow of their lives can then bring a sense of relief. I encourage you this year to take time to reflect. To pause longer than you would like to. Carefully look at areas of your lives that could be different, and with the support of others, embrace change. Remember, we are meant to learn and to grow throughout our lives.

For Christmas this year, we chose to draw names. As my kids are getting older, and have some money of their own, buying for one instead of for all, seemed a popular idea. I drew my wife's name. Right away I knew what I wanted to get her. Dr. Alex Russell's book, *Drop the Worry Ball: How to Parent in the Age of Entitlement*. Christmas presents can sometimes take the form of suggestions. A dangerous game indeed. For my wife and I, parenting has always been an area of change and growth. Although we both agree with many aspects of Russell's work, there is still challenge for both of us. Luckily, my present was well received (as was the additional gift I made sure to buy). Fortune favors the bold.

As the school community of Westboro moves into the New Year, I want our conversation about resiliency and anxiety to come with us. If you missed the December newsletter, it may be worth revisiting. It is here where I introduced Dr. Russell's work as well as highlighting Dr. Martin Brokenleg and Dr. Gordon Neufeld. I further drew on the tension inside the parent's heart where we desire resiliency in our children but may be afraid of the cost. Where we are their compassionate supports who let them rise and fall and find their way.

It is not only Westboro that are in the midst of these conversations of anxiety and resiliency. This year I have come across a multitude of talks and workshops and conferences. They are for us. For parents and teachers and other caregivers. There are two that I would like to highlight for the month of January.

The session is titled "Breaking the Cycle of Anxiety: A Step by Step Approach" (K-12) Adults only. This session is free. ## INCLEMENT WEATHER

With the winter season well underway, we want to remind parents to dress children appropriately for the weather when getting ready for school or the bus. The weather often changes unexpectedly throughout the day, so please select suitable outerwear and ensure your child is prepared for changing conditions.

If inclement weather conditions occur, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) will advise parents of any bus cancellations using various communications tools including: automated-telephone messages, alerts posted on [www.eips.ca](http://www.eips.ca) and school websites, Twitter, Facebook, local radio stations, and on Versatrans My Stop.

Decisions regarding bus cancellations are guided by EIPS administrative procedures that states: "school bus service may be suspended when...Environment Canada reports a temperature of -40 C." Other reasons for suspending or delaying school bus services include adverse weather and poor road condition.

When school bus services are suspended, schools will remain open to students. EIPS believes parents have the right and responsibility to make choices for their children based on their beliefs and perceptions of safety during times of inclement weather.
