

# COUNSELLOR'S CORNER

Change is the one constant that we can truly rely on. The ground beneath us always seems to be in motion. June seems to be one of those times when we realize it the most. The familiar is coming to an end as the school year unravels and we look for a foothold in the upcoming September. As we do, June becomes a complex time of year. A challenging time for students and teachers and parents alike. For we are both coming and going.

June is still a time of education and of growth. Even if the weather calls us into July. Teachers seek to engage students whose attention drifts to the open windows. Learners work to climb the final tasks which have become mountains. It is a time of digging deep. A time of finishing well. A time when the importance of the curriculum may become overshadowed by the importance of our character. A time of Resilience. Let us remember our conversations about Growth Mindsets, Grit, and Stress. May they serve us well.

Schools know all too well what lies on the other side of June. Planning is an essential part of what we do. Our transition work directly involves our students as well. Transition classes will take place where students spend time with their new teacher. Classroom tours will occur. Class discussion are welcomed and planned for. We have found that all of this really helps. It helps to reduce anxiety. Yet we know that it will not alleviate all the worry that our students may experience, whether here in June or deep into the last days of August. In his book, Drop the Worry Ball, Dr. Alex Russell encourages us to not rush in and take the worry from our kids but rather to support our kids with their worry. This is not a dismissive action but rather one that requires more from us. And it's not easy to do. Our kids' excitement about next year may become replaced with more and more anxiety. Hard questions may begin to surface. What if my new teacher doesn't like me? What if they don't know how to help me like my last teacher did? What if my classes are too hard? What if I have no one to play with? What if next year is a bad year? We can perform a disservice to our kids if we bombard them with solutions or if we downplay their reality, offering an easier version of the truth. What's left to do? May I encourage you to sit with them in their worry? Let them know that you hear them and that their questions are good questions. Take time. You may find that there are deeper fears and bigger questions beneath. Offer empathy. That others have felt this way before. Even you. Offer what you know and ask them what they can do. Coach and support. Let them know that you are with them no matter what may come.

Soon June will let go of its hold on time. Summer will be upon us all. Embrace the chance for memories that last a lifetime. Celebrate family and time together. And if I could offer one piece of advice for the coming year - read. In backyards and on beaches and in libraries and on lawn chairs - read. Encourage your kids to read books they like and discover books they love. Reading is the best indicator of success for next September and it is truly a doorway to a better life.

September won't quite look like we thought it would. It never does. Change is the constant that we can rely on. For some of us, there will be even more change than others. For our grade sixes that will graduate to Junior High and for families that will move away, next year will be big. It is amongst this group that I find myself. I have accepted a counseling position at Salisbury Composite High School. I have loved being a part of the Westboro family and supporting your kids through the last year and a half of their lives. What an honor it has been. This September a new counselor will come and she is wonderful. New families will move in and another year of little ones in kindergarten will fill the halls. Westboro is ever changing. Enjoy your time here as I have done. May it continue to be a place to grow our kids. To prepare them for the changing world that will soon be theirs.

## 2017-18 EIPS PARENT SURVEY RESULTS REPORT

The results are now available for the 2017-18 EIPS Parent Survey conducted in March. Thank you to all families who took the time to share their feedback with the Division. The survey included 20 questions related to the three priorities outlined in the EIPS 2015-2018 Three-Year Education Plan:

- Priority 1: Promote growth and success for all students
- Priority 2: Enhance high quality learning and working environments
- Priority 3: Enhance public education through effective engagement, partnerships and communication

The overall Division results represent 2,918 responses from parents and guardians across EIPS. This was an increase in responses from 2,678 in the previous year.



Elk Island Public Schools is once again offering its Little Elk Island Adventure, a fun and informative program for *first-time school bus riders*.

Annually, Student Transportation offers the Little Elk Island Adventure to new riders and their parents. The program's aim is to help ease any anxieties a family may have about riding the bus before even starting school. Through a series of activities, riders learn about: school bus safety, danger zones, tips on boarding and how to sit properly on the bus. After that, both the children and parents hop on the bus to practice what they've learned and then adventure out on a short ride.

When completing the survey keep in mind the government has said there is no more money for Student Transportation, which means if something new is funded something else may be lost. **The survey closes June 15, 2018**.
