# STUDENT TRANSPORTATION: 2021-22 REGISTRATION IS NOW OPEN

Planning to use Student Transportation in the 2021–22 school year? If so, make sure your child is registered so Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) can plan routes and send your child a bus pass before the first day of school.

All students who indicated needing transportation services through the returning student registration process are now registered. Families registered will receive tentative route schedules and invoices by the end of the month—fees are due June 30, 2021.

**NOTE:** As of May 13th, parents will have the ability to transfer overpayment credits between siblings, between schools, and between school and Transportation.


