### **COMPLETE THE RETURNING STUDENT REGISTRATION: FEBRUARY 1-28**

Elk Island Public Schools' (EIPS) returning student registration process is now open. All returning students must complete the online Returning Student Registration Form to confirm their child's enrolment in a school for the upcoming 2022-23 school year. Additionally, students who want to attend a non-designated school need to make that request through the returning student registration process—acceptance is based on available space. **All returning EIPS students are required to complete the form by Feb. 28, 2022**.

To access the Returning Student Registration Form, simply log in to the **PowerSchool Parent Portal**.

### **KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION STARTS FEBRUARY 1**

Is your child turning five on or before Dec. 31, 2022? If so, it's now time to register for kindergarten. To register, simply complete the online registration form at <u>eips.ca/kindergarten</u>.

To help families prepare, Elk Island Public Schools has put together an online <u>EIPS Kindergarten</u> <u>Tool kit</u> to make the transition as smooth as possible. The kit includes information on registration, important dates, programming options, what to expect, eligibility, how to find your designated school, transportation and more.

### **CAREGIVER EDUCATION SESSIONS**

Alberta Health Services is hosting a series of caregiver information sessions focused on ways to support students' mental health. The sessions are free and geared toward parents, caregivers, teachers and community members who want to learn more about challenges impacting children and adolescents. ### EIPS WEBPAGE TRACKING CLASS TRANSITIONS

Over the last week, Elk Island Public Schools (EIPS) heard from several families asking for information about reported COVID-19 cases in schools and the impact on in-school learning. As such, EIPS now reports classes or grade groups that transition to temporary online learning. Some school divisions also report student and staff absences related to COVID-19 or illness. EIPS has not followed that practice because the data cannot be confirmed through PCR testing or through investigation by Alberta Health Services and is ultimately based on incomplete anecdotal reporting.

Since there is no way to accurately report the cases, all EIPS schools follow a process to manage student and staff absences. When a school has a significant number of absences—because of student illness in a class or grade cohort, or because staff or substitute coverage isn't possible—it submits report to EIPS. Next, a Division-level investigation occurs. If deemed appropriate, the class or grade cohort may transition to temporary online learning for a set number of days—similar to how students learned online last year, using Brightspace.

When this occurs:

- Kindergarten to Grade 6 classes will remain home for a total of five school days.
- Junior and senior high classes will remain home for a total of five calendar days.

The difference between the approach for elementary students, and those in junior and senior high, reflect immunization rates. In Alberta, only 8.4 per cent students aged 5 to 11 years are fully vaccinated, while those aged 12 to 14, and 15 to 19, are at 80 and 81.9 per cent respectively.

Families whose children will be transitioned to temporary online learning are notified by the school and sent detailed information outlining duration, scheduling, important links and resources.

We thank EIPS families for sharing their feedback and concerns about reporting on illness in schools. We are hopeful access to this information will provide insight into the current situation in EIPS schools and classrooms.
