MUSIC UPDATE FROM MS. WATSON

Grade 4/5/6 students now have permission to take recorders home. Students have been asked to check with the adults in their household about where and when they can practice their recorders properly. They may also ask you where to play their recorder very badly—pick a good spot where you can't hear them make horrible sounds with their recorders. Half the fun is figuring out what it sounds like when you play it wrong and learning how to fix it.

Recorders should always be in school backpacks when not in use, so students have them at the school for music classes and extra activities. With their recorders students have a green packet of songs to play and information to access the musicplayonline.com website. The website should be accessible on any computer or tablet. On the website students can find recorder music play-alongs and lots of other music activities and games.

Playing beautifully takes practice, so please be patient while your student learns this new skill!

PERMISSION CLICK

EIPS has begun migrating school and Division forms to the online Permission Click platform. Many families will have already received one or more forms within the new system. Permission Click makes the form submission process for families simple and straightforward. Forms are also easily accessible and fillable from your mobile device. Families will generally receive forms in one of two ways—sent as a link within a SchoolMessenger email or in a direct email from Permission Click sent to the first parent or guardian on record in PowerSchool. Be sure to add notifications@permissionclick.com to your safe sender list to ensure required forms aren't mistakenly directed to your junk mail folder.


FUNDRAISE WITH US!
