Teacher Report: Courtney Richard

- Alberta Opera is booked for January 2023 at the school
- The school is receiving Treaty 6 and Métis flags to display, with the option to raise them in June or September. We have chosen to have an assembly and ceremony on Jun 21st (National Indigenous Peoples Day) to raise the flags.
 - Courtney Richard has been working with the Grade 6 classes to rewrite our school's land acknowledgement. There are 10 sentences each with a teaching to go with, and google slides have been created to go along with.
 - Learning kits have also been created
- The offer was made to parent council to speak at the final assembly, regarding what council does at the school
- The folk family dance event is likely going to be postponed to the fall, dependent on county permits which require approximately 3 months in advance to process.
- Two teachers are retiring this year, and one is moving on
 - Christan Rasmussen to look at gift options for them
