Trustee Report Trina Boymook

- At the Board's January 19 meeting the Board approved of a Ukrainian Language and Culture to replace the bilingual program. At this meeting the Board also approved the Ukrainian Language and Culture and German Language and Cultural programs as Alternative Programs that will fall under the authority of the Board.
- A recommendation on the Logos program will be considered at the Board's March 16 Board meeting.
- Phase 2 of the French Immersion engagement session was held on February 7. The information gathered through the in person session and online surveys will inform the next public engagement session for French Immersion being held on April 13. The Board will hear the Superintendent's recommendation at our June 2023 Board meeting where the Board will consider the recommendations.
- The Budget will be tabled on February 28. We remain hopeful that the funds for construction will be included in the budget for Sherwood Heights Replacement school.
- The Board will begin its budget planning discussions starting March 2. The Board will consider our assurance reviews, stakeholder survey, progress being made within current initiatives and reserve status
- Reregistration Process taking place through the month of February. There are five schools with close boundaries for the 2023-24 school year. Ardrossan Elementary, Ardrossan Junior/Senior, Davidson Creek, James Mowatt and SouthPointe. Those that are planning on registering to a non-designated school or an alternative program must do so by February 28.
- After completing a Canadian wide Superintendent search, the Board of Trustees approved the appointment of Sandra Stoddard as EIPS next Superintendent as of July 1, 2023. Sandra has been with EIPS for over 6 years as the Associate Superintendent of Supports for Students. Her experience extends provincially, as well as around the world in shaping education policy and practices. She has lead significant initiatives on behalf of the Board, Curriculum implementation, development and execution of the Board's Mental Health Strategic Plan (inclusive of mental health pilot project) to name a few. The Board is confident that Sandra will continue to build on our successes and lead us as we continue to grow and evolve as one of the best school divisions in the province.
