SCHOOL FEES

School fees for the 2023-24 school year are posted on the <u>PowerSchool Parent Portal</u>. To access your fee information, simply log in to the PowerSchool Parent Portal and go to "Student Fees." There you can view fees and pay them online using a credit card.

For more information about school fees, waivers and payment deadlines, visit eips.ca/schools/fees. And, if you have questions, think there is an error or need help creating a PowerSchool Parent Portal account, contact your child's school directly before the summer break.

NOTE: Pursuant to <u>Board Policy 23: School Fees</u> and <u>Administrative Procedure 505: School and Administrative Fees</u>, EIPS will forward any unpaid 2023 fee amounts to a collection agency. To prevent this from happening, remember to pay your fees before Aug. 31, 2024

FIRST DAY OF CLASSES FOR 2024-25

Grades 1 - 6 classes resume on Thursday, August 29.

This week of school will be a staggered start for our kindergarten classes which was previously scheduled. If you did not receive your information, please contact the office on or after August 22 for your start date. Full-day kindergarten classes begin on Thursday, September 5, 2024.

FRIENDS CLUB OUT OF SCHOOL DAY CARE

The accredited and licensed Friends Club Daycare and Out of School Care, housed inside Westboro Elementary School is now accepting registration for children 3 to 5 years old, Kindergarten children and grade 1 to 6 students.

We offer a breakfast program and afternoon snacks, indoor sports in our school gymnasium, outdoor play, soccer club, baking/cooking club, fun projects, field trips, arts, crafts and games.

Full time child care spaces are available and subsidized as available.

Our center provides a quality preschool and kindergarten program that enhances the overall development of children through the creation of a positive self-concept, encouraging a love of learning and developing the skills to play, and interacting cooperatively in a group setting. These objectives are fulfilled through a "learn through play" environment with an emphasis on the social, emotional, physical, creative and intellectual development of each child. By providing a "learn through play" environment, each child can learn to develop at an individual pace while within an environment that is safe, friendly and stimulating; the children are provided with "free play" time. The child may choose his or her own area to play with toys, puzzles or games, the activity centers, participate in a craft or select a quiet area for reading or just being alone. During circle time, the children sing, participate in group discussions and stories that enable them to learn about themselves and the world.

In addition, all special occasions and holidays such as Halloween, Christmas, Valentine's Day, Mother's Day etc. will be celebrated with parties or special activities. Outside play is also an important part of the curriculum.

LITTLE ELK ISLAND ADVENTURE 2024

Elk Island Public Schools' Student Transportation has a program for First Time Bus Riders and their parents called the Little Elk Island Adventure. Students and parents will learn:

- How to be safe when around the bus
- What the Danger Zone is and where it is located
- How to board the bus and scan their bus pass
- How to sit properly on the school bus
- EIPS' Code of Conduct

The session includes an opportunity for parents and their student to take a short ride on a school bus.
